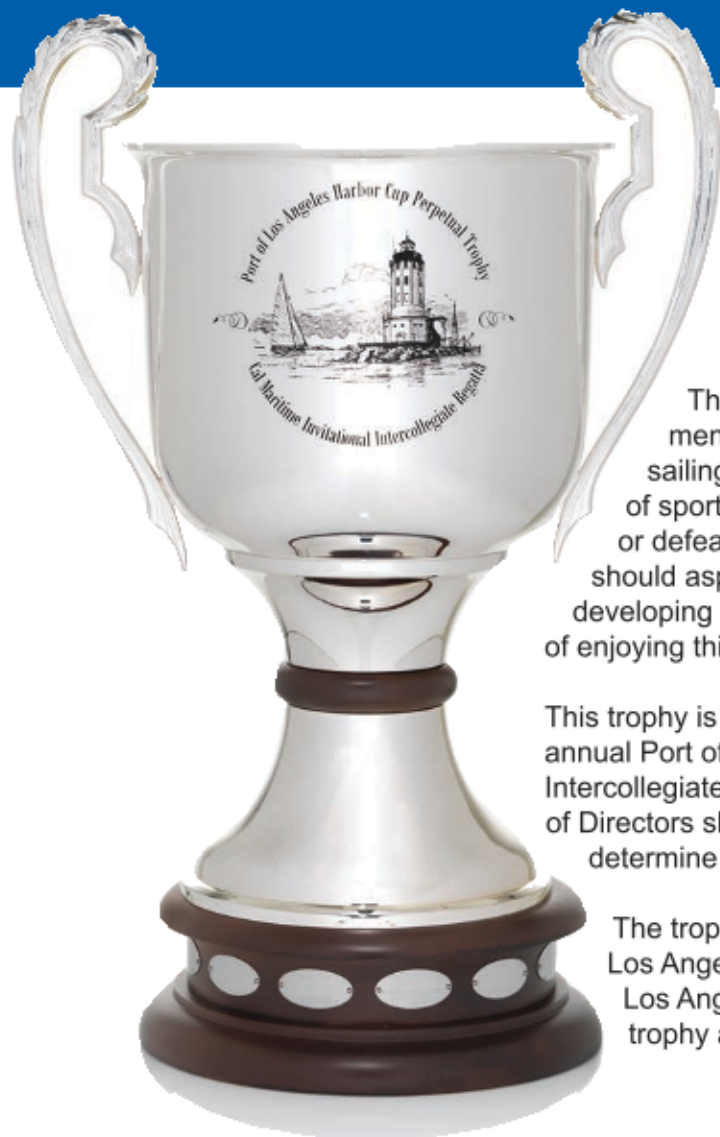

The Port of Los Angeles strongly encourages young men and women to enjoy the benefits of competitive sailing. Corinthian values that promote the highest level of sportsmanship, fairness, courtesy and grace in victory or defeat are valuable traits that all young men and women should aspire. Environmental awareness, stewardship and developing a love of the ocean are other important by-products of enjoying this sport at an early age.

This trophy is awarded to the winning team competing in the annual Port of Los Angeles Harbor Cup — Cal Maritime Invitational Intercollegiate Regatta. The Los Angeles Yacht Club Board of Directors shall have, and retain, full power and authority to determine all questions regarding the awarding of this trophy.

The trophy shall be kept and displayed on the premises of the Los Angeles Yacht Club and maintained in good condition; the Los Angeles Yacht Club Board of Directors may display this trophy at an alternate location at their sole discretion.

Port of Los Angeles Harbor Cup Cal Maritime Invitational Intercollegiate Regatta **Los Angeles Yacht Club History**

1901 - South Coast Yacht Club

South Coast Yacht Club is formed by avid sailors and power boaters from the Los Angeles area.

1902 - Red, White & Blue Burgee

The red, white and blue triangular burgee is created and registered.

1906 - The Transpacific Race

South Coast Yacht Club stages the first Los Angeles-to-Honolulu transpacific yacht race, known today as Transpac.

1920 - Los Angeles Yacht Club

South Coast Yacht Club changes its name to Los Angeles Yacht Club. LA Yacht Club and Los Angeles Motor Boat Club later consolidate their membership in 1922 and move into a shared facility with California Yacht Club.

1928 - Wednesday Luncheon

LA Yacht Club Commodore Robert Millison inaugurates Wednesday Luncheons.

1936 - Fish Harbor

LA Yacht Club separates from their shared clubhouse with California Yacht Club and moves to Fish Harbor.

1946 - Howland's Landing, Catalina Island

LA Yacht Club signs a lease with the Catalina Island Co. for Howland's Landing.

1992 - Los Angeles Yacht Club Relocated

Given the rise in commercial traffic, the Club's Fish Harbor location becomes undesirable. LA Yacht Club is relocated to Cabrillo Way Marina in San Pedro, California.

2008 - The Port of Los Angeles Harbor Cup

February 12th: The Port of Los Angeles gives LA Yacht Club the Port of Los Angeles Harbor Cup Perpetual Trophy. Maine Maritime Academy wins the inaugural Port of Los Angeles Harbor Cup, hosted by LA Yacht Club.

Kimball Livingston is an international sailor, author, screenwriter and commentator who built a career of doing, then talking about the doing, in print and in person.

Within days of finishing a master's degree he was on the ocean racing a sailboat to Mexico; it was a good ride, made a good story with nothing whatsoever to do with his former field of study, and...

..he never looked back.

Later in his life, Livingston recognized a one-time opportunity and fulfilled a mission to fit in the milestone editions of the Centennial Transpacific Yacht Race, Centennial Newport-Bermuda Race and the 100th running of Chicago Yacht Club Race to Mackinac — America's three classic distance races.

As commodore of St. Francis Yacht Club in 2016, he recognized a need to drive change in the club's junior program. Once he started this challenge, he never looked back and is now the club's Staff Commodore Ambassador to Youth Sailing, Club Curator, and Historian ("I get 'em coming and going.").

A former commodore of the Pacific Coast Yachting Association, he serves on the Transpac board, the National Sailing Hall of Fame's selection panel and, most recently, on the finalist panel for the US Rolex Yachtsman/Yachtswoman of the Year.

Founded in the early 2000s, the University of Victoria Sailing Club initially ran out of the Royal Victoria Yacht Club and conducted lessons until enough money was raised to purchase a fleet of FJs and host regattas.

Throughout the next two decades, UVic sailing competed in dinghy regattas around North America while it developed a big boat racing program. In 2023, keelboat racing became more prevalent in Canadian Collegiate sailing, with the inaugural match racing national championship hosted February of 2023 in West Vancouver (UVic placed 3rd). Later in 2023, UVic sailing won its inaugural keelboat national championship in Toronto and successfully defended that title in 2024.

UVic sailing also hosted and won the 2024 Match Racing National Championship in conjunction with the Royal Vancouver Yacht Club; the program continues to develop its keelboat program and the team looks forward to defending its match racing title in March, 2025.
