The trophy shall be kept and displayed on the premises of the Los Angeles Yacht Club and maintained in good condition; the Los Angeles Yacht Club Board of Directors may display this trophy at an alternate location at their sole discretion.



Port of Los Angeles Harbor Cup Cal Maritime Invitational Intercollegiate Regatta Keynote Speaker • Sally Lindsay Honey



Sally Lindsay Honey grew up sailing keelboats on Lake Michigan and Chesapeake Bay, including a Newport-Bermuda race with her dad. After graduating college, Honey worked in anthropological research at Harvard, before transitioning to sailmaking at Hood in Marblehead, then North Sails in Connecticut. She raced a dozen onedesign classes, but primarily campaigned 5-0-5 dinghies for 20 years, winning the North Americans and competed in seven World Championships.

A fter moving to Palo Alto, Sally ran her own sail loft/ industrial sewing business for 28 years before returning to keelboats.

I six Hawai'i races, four were on her Cal 40: two double-handed with her husband, Stan Honey,

(winning the Pacific Cup overall) and two with a crew of four — one all women. She navigated the Newport Bermuda race, raced the Chicago-Mackinac Island race, spent two summers cruising the Pacific Northwest, another five months living aboard a 45-foot sailboat in Antigua, one summer sailing an Alden schooner in St. Thomas and the last eight years cruising her Cal 40 with Stan from San Francisco to Maine via the Panama Canal. Last summer culminated with a Newport Bermuda Race championship, alongside her husband and three excellent crew members, with a final double-handed delivery from Bermuda to Annapolis.

Twice named Rolex Yachtswoman of the Year, Honey served on multiple sailing boards and safety review panels, became an on-the-water volunteer for the 34th America's Cup and edited a Safety-at-Sea Handbook for US Sailing. She currently serves as chair of the World Sailing Offshore Special Regulations Sub-committee and on the US Sailing Safety at Sea and NYYC Seamanship committees.

The two-time defending Harbor Cup champions return to the Port of Los Angeles seeking the program's ninth title in the 15-race history of this event.

Cal Maritime also seeks its second major title of the season; it became the sixth school in Kennedy Cup history to successfully defend its crown after winning the John F. Kennedy Memorial Trophy for the fifth time in school history last November.



are excited about this opportunity to compete in the 2023 Harbor Cup against many of the top teams in the country.






